For those candidates desiring only an online delivery format, the core courses may also be taken online. ****	EDD 9001 – Advanced Perspectives on Literacy Issues and EDD 9002 – The Reading Theory: Research and Practice courses were developed especially for those students who might not have a strong background in reading methods. These students should take these two courses as prerequisites to and/or co-requisites with the other reading courses. Both are foundation classes that offer extensive knowledge of the reading process as well as reading in content areas. Students without a reading background will find it extremely difficult to flourish in the remaining concentration courses. (Students who already have knowledge of reading methods and/or degrees in reading will not need to take these courses and may substitute them for electives).
*****	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Applied Dissertation Services begin at the 25th month (beginning of 3rd year) from the initial term of enrollment irrespective of registration records. At this time, candidates will automatically be placed in ADS 8090 - Applied Dissertation Services I, per term, for a period of up to one year (3 terms). ADS 8090 has a \$100.00 tuition charge + services fees (subject to change). Candidates who do not complete the program within the time period of three years must register for ADS 8091 - Applied Dissertation Services II. • ADS 8091 - Applied Dissertation Services II begins at the 37th month (beginning of 4th year) from the initial term of enrollment irrespective of registration records. At this time, candidates will be responsible for registering for ADS 8091-Applied Dissertation Services II, per term and every term thereafter after dissertation is officially approved by the Applied Research Center. ADS 8091 has a \$2,300.00 tuition charge + services fees (subject to change).

Candidates have three options to complete the program:

- One concentration and electives (69 credit hours), **OR**
- One concentration and one minor (69+ credit hours depending on the chosen concentration). Yet, some of the concentrations have courses that overlap. It is not always necessary to go over the 69 hour credit load to graduate, **OR**
- Two concentrations (candidates following this option will graduate with 69 or up to 93 credit depending on the chosen concentration).
