All the camps are taught by South Florida Writing Project teacher consultants. The class sizes are small, averaging 13-15 students. The camps are held at one of the Nova Southeastern University sites and several Broward County Schools. Each camp session runs for three weeks.

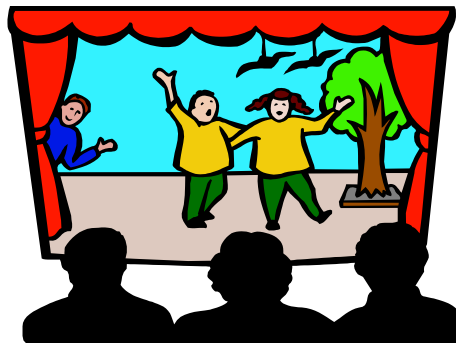
What makes a child a good candidate for camp?

We discourage parents from enrolling children who are really not interested in attending. Campers will spend a few hours writing everyday, so if your child does not like to write, this is probably not the camp for him/her.
